Offering a range of professional development topics as evening twilight lectures, full day seminars and conference presentation, including some hands on sessions, Justine and Nicole will inspire you to say yes to play every day. They will show you how to gain more space in your environment, walk you through the benefits of introducing loose-parts into your program and encourage you to open the doors to play and look at your space as 'one space' not the indoors *and* the outdoors.

Short professional development topics [1,2 & 3]

ONE: Inviting play spaces

Do you struggle to create truly inviting play spaces for the children in your care?

Inviting play spaces are the places we provide for our children where they are free to follow their own agendas and unrestricted by adult expectations. Spaces where adults provide unspoken permission for play. The kind of environments we all loved playing in when we ourselves were children ... Remember playing with Granma's old 'stuff', repurposed items and plenty natural materials? The kinds of things that are really, really cheap to buy, fun to scavenge and often free, including of course incorporating things you already have at hand ... Usually items of little or no value to adults but in a child's eyes they are treasures!!

This topic includes a hands-on playing component.

TWO: Communicating and working respectfully with colleagues to effect change

There are many pressures associated with our jobs so learning to communicate & work effectively with colleagues is a major aspect that can make-or-break a great team.

Change can be hard ... really hard ... and we all know at times it can be difficult to navigate our way through workplace relationships because of differing opinions. If we don't voice our concerns when they arise however it can begin to effect our job satisfaction.

We have worked together for many years so we know well the ups and downs of teamwork. We aim you show you ways to nurture these relationships and develop a positive sense of community to ensure a stronger sense of teamwork, respect and honesty in your work life relationships.

In this session we will discuss ways to raise and tackle delicate and at times difficult issues, while maintaining your professionalism towards colleagues, families and the children in your care.

THREE: Play opportunities on a limited budget: A journey of op-shops, real materials and loose parts

This session will take participants on a journey as we share ideas on how we introduced op shop and loose part finds into the environment.

We will ask you to reflect upon your own environments and question your current practice.

We will reveal where this journey has taken us and how the questions we asked along the way all point to play being most important to children and therefore play should be the most important thing to us.

Throughout this session, participants will gain knowledge of where to seek resources, how to offer those resources and how to think about giving play spaces back to children.

Long day professional development topics [4 & 5]

FOUR: Play spaces without borders

Some people still believe that in order for children to be actively learning they need to be sitting down at a table doing 'table-top-activities' with things purchased from catalogues ... well it just isn't so.

During this full day session participants will be given space and time to immerse themselves in loose parts play ... including natural and repurposed materials.

This session will provide valuable information and experience to support and inspire you to leave with a plan of action for major change in the way you present play experiences for the children in your care, including giving away our best kept secrets on how to find and source these awesome materials.

We will encourage you to reflect on your current practice and empower you with confidence to introduce and discuss these open ended, ambiguous play materials with colleagues, committees and parents.

A visual journey that documents practical ways for creating these changes in your environment will be woven through this full day, hands on session.

FIVE: Myth busting the archaic term 'indoor/outdoor' program

Do you know what the main barrier standing in your way of running a successful 'fluid' early childhood program is?

We have heard all the excuses in the world ... blaming parents, regulations, co-workers, money, materials, time, even the weather ... but none of those are what is truly stopping you.

In this session we will myth bust the outdated term "indoor/outdoor" program. It's time to break down the barriers ... and the walls ... by highlighting the importance of running a fluid child centered program, every single day, within your setting.

We will put an emphasis on the importance of children being given time and space to spend as much of the day they choose in the outdoor environment. By supporting children's rights to choose were they play, for how long they play, with whom they play and with what they play, you can be confident in knowing you are offering best practice play opportunities for the children in your care.
